# GROWTH TRAJECTORY OF BSM



- 1969 – Establishment of organization on the auspicious occasion of Ram Navami, Yugabda 5071 (27 March, 1969) in Mumbai.
- 1969 – On April 19, BSM received the registration number F-1738 from Mumbai Charity Commissioner.
- 1977 – Drafting of ‘National Education Policy’ began at the first national convention.
- 1979 – First National Conference on ‘National Education Policy’ held in Delhi.
- 1986 – On May 5, a draft related to education policy presented before the Parliament by a delegation of BSM.
- 1992 – Emergence of Akhil Bharatiya Rashtriya Shaikshik Mahasangh (ABRSM) from Shikshan Mandal.
- 1993 – Launch of new Gatividhis under the names of Shaley-Prakalp and Mahila Prakoshth.
- 2000 – First Rashtriya Adhiveshan held in Kanpur.
- 2007 – Second Rashtriya Adhiveshan held in Visakhapatnam.
- 2009 – Annual magazine ‘Darshan’ launched.
- 2012 – Third Rashtriya Adhiveshan organized in Nagpur.
- 2015 – Fourth Rashtriya Adhiveshan inaugurated by the then Education Minister Smt. Smriti Irani ji in Gwalior. In-depth deliberations were focused on the draft of National Education Policy.
- 2016 – Establishment of RFRF in Nagpur.
- 2017 – International Conference on ‘Bharat Bodh’ inaugurated by the then Hon’ble President Shri Pranab Mukherjee in New Delhi.
- 2017 – Launch of Vistarak Yojana.

# GROWTH TRAJECTORY OF BSM



- 2018 – International Virat Gurukul Sammelan held in Ujjain from April 28 to 30.
- 2018 – First Conference of Academic Leadership (CAL1) inaugurated by the Honorable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji in New Delhi on September 29.
- 2018 – Fifth Rashtriya Adhiveshan organized in Faridabad in November.
- 2019 – In the month of February, ‘International Conference on Development Discourse’ inaugurated by the then Hon. Vice President Shri Venkaiah Naidu ji in Hyderabad.
- 2019 – On July 27, the second Conference of Academic Leadership (CAL2) regarding the National Education Policy was jointly organized by AICTE, UGC, and IGNOU. The then Education Minister Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank attended the event as Chief Guest.
- 2019 – Adoption of the DHYEYA VAKYA.
- 2020 – Commencement of SANYOGI SHIVIR in Kashi Prant.
- 2021 – On January 21, the third Conference of Academic Leadership (CAL3) regarding the National Education Policy was inaugurated by Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog Dr. Rajiv Kumar. Subsequently, 586 Anandshalas were conducted nationwide.
- 2022 – On April 23–24, the fourth Conference of Academic Leadership (CAL4) regarding the National Education Policy was inaugurated in Nagpur by Honorable Minister of Road Transport and Highways Shri Nitin Gadkari ji.
- 2022 – Second Sanyogi Shivar organized in Bheemtal, Uttarakhand in August.
- 2022 – ‘All India Young Researchers Conclave’ of three days, inaugurated by Honorable Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh on November 11.
- 2023 – Prant-level Sanyogi Shivar held in Vaishali, Uttar Bihar Prant in June.
- 2023 – With the motto of ‘Aatmavat Sarvabhuteshu’, Delhi Prant commenced the 21-day Anubhuti Shivar, establishing it as a continuing tradition.

- 2024 – Anubhuti Shivar organized by Delhi Prant in Devprayag, Uttarakhand in June.
- 2024 – Formal launch of Mandal Karya-Vibhag, Bharatiya Gyan Sampada Gatividhi, Shikshak-Shiksha Gatividhi, Uchcha Shiksha Gatividhi, and Education and Technology Gatividhi in June.

- The most crucial and fundamental unit of Bharatiya Shikshan Mandal.
  - A dedicated platform for individuals passionate about education to engage in deep understanding and constructive dialogue on education-related issues.
  - Each Mandal should ideally comprise of minimum 20 participants, with a clearly documented and well-maintained participants' list.
  - A minimum of 4 members must be present to conduct a mandal.
  - Regularly conducting, collective participation, constructive discussions, and detailed documentation are essential.

# PROCESS OF KARYAKARTA DEVELOPMENT



1. **Entry** : Through participation in programs
2. **Karyakarta** : Regular and consistent participation in the mandal for one hour per week
3. **Mandal Convener** : Conducting one's own mandal by fulfilling the role of mandal convener
4. **Institutional Coordinator:** Coordinator of an educational institution
5. **Pravasi Karyakarta** : Minimum two days of pravasi in a month for organizational and academic work
6. **Short-term Vistarak** : Minimum time period of 15 days should be devoted in a year
7. **Long-term Vistarak** : Minimum time period of 2 years should be devoted
8. **Vanaprasthi** : Minimum time period of 1 to 2 years should be devoted



